


Brief Summary of Annual CAIRIBU Meeting December 3- 4, 2020

The first-ever remote CAIRIBU annual meeting was a huge success. Participants overwhelmingly reported greater understanding of multidisciplinary perspectives in benign urology research (Fig 1) as enhanced enthusiasm for doing research (Fig 2). This year the meeting was opened to those outside of the CAIRIBU Community. Of the 200 registrants, approximately 35% were from outside of CAIRIBU. There was strong participation by CAIRIBU Centers and Programs, includina bv trainees and investigators who collectively submitted and presented 48 abstracts.


