P20 Center Inter-Institutional Exchange Program

We are excited to announce this new inter-institutional exchange program to promote networking and collaboration among young investigators (and their sponsoring research programs/principal investigators) studying benign urology and/or machine learning. In this program, we will select one young investigator (resident, fellow, masters, doctoral, post-doctoral candidate) from a US based institution to come to CHOP/Penn for 2 days to develop relationships with peers, senior faculty, and leading researchers; discuss future collaborations; and present data from their research. Simultaneously, a young investigator from CHOP/Penn will travel to the same collaborative US based institution for a similar immersive experience. Expenses related to travel and housing during the 2 day experience will be covered. We anticipate this exchange will take place in September 2021.

We are particularly interested in young investigators exploring the application of machine learning to benign urology or nephrology, but would be open to investigators who apply machine learning to other related fields of clinical adult or pediatric medicine.
