#### CAIRIBU at AUA 2022



CAIRIBU investigators and trainees will make a significant impact in benign urology at this year's annual meeting of the American Urological Association. More than 50 CAIRIBU-affiliated researchers will have a presence at the AUA meeting as abstract presenters, speakers, panelists,

course faculty, hands-on skills training proctors, session moderators, and abstract co-authors.

Here's some details about CAIRIBU-related benign urologic clinical and research activities at the meeting (note that several CAIRIBU investigators are also involved in urologic cancer-related presentations and sessions - these are not included here):

- 20 abstracts related to benign urology (stones, bladder, infection, pediatrics, and surgery) will be presented by CAIRIBU-affiliated trainees and investigators in a variety of poster, podium, and video sessions
- 22 CAIRIBU leaders are involved as faculty in courses, proctors in hands-on skills training activities, and presenters or panelists in plenary sessions
- More than a dozen CAIRIBU investigators are invited speakers at specialty society programs, including the Society of Urodynamics, Female Pelvic Medicine & Urogenital Reconstruction, Sexual Medicine Society of North America, Society for Basic Urologic Research, Geriatric Urological Society, Society for the Study of Male Reproduction, and the Research on Calculus Kinetics Society

<u>Current CAIRIBU P20 Centers for Interdisciplinary Research in Benign Urology</u> will have a particularly strong presence at the AUA meeting as presenters, speakers, abstract-co-authors, faculty, etc. These include: **Beaumont Hospital-Oakland University** (PIs, Bernadette Zwaans, PhD and Michael Chancellor, MD), **Children's Hospital of Philadelphia-University of Pennsylvania** (PI, Gregory Tasian, MD), **Duke University** (PI, Pei Zhong, PhD), and **University of Alabama at Birmingham** (PI, Dean Assimos, MD). Other P20 Centers associated with activities at the meeting are **Vanderbilt University** (PI, Maria Hadjifrangiskou, PhD), **Medical College of Wisconsin** (PI, Kathryn Flynn, PhD), and **Albert Einstein College of Medicine** (PI, Kelvin Davies, PhD).

<u>Current CAIRIBU U54 George M. O'Brien Urology Research Centers</u> making a mark at the meeting include several collaborators associated with the **Stanford University Center** (PI, James Brooks, MD) and multiple trainees and investigators from the **UW-Madison Center** (PI, Will Ricke, PhD). Several current and prior CAIRIBU K12 Scholars from all 4 <u>CAIRIBU-affiliated K12 Career Development Programs</u> will present their work, moderate sessions, deliver invited presentations, and/or are abstract co-authors.
