Bridging Basic and Clinical Science to Understand Urologic Disease

Neural mechanisms underlie a range of benign urologic diseases and conditions. Altered innervation of the bladder, urethra, ureters, prostate, erectile tissue, and/or other pelvic structures has a range of effects - including pain, dysfunction, and/or cross-sensitization - contributing to a spectrum of urologic diseases and conditions. The overall goal of this workshop is to identify persistent gaps in knowledge related to the interaction between the nervous system and the genitourinary system; how that interaction contributes to benign urologic diseases and disorders; and how multidisciplinary basic, translational, and clinical research can fill these gaps and ultimately enhance prevention, diagnosis, and therapy of benign urologic conditions. # CAIRIBU Collaboration Wins Cooperative Research Project Award (U18) from AHRQ



Bridging Community-Based Continence Promotion and Primary Care

Dr. Heidi Wendell Brown (top left), a former K12 Scholar in the <a href="UW-Madison KURe Program">UW-Madison KURe Program</a>, formed a collaboration with Drs. Kathryn Flynn (middle left) and Joan Neuner (bottom left), PI and Co-Investigator of the <a href="CAIRIBU P20">CAIRIBU P20</a> <a href="Exploratory Center at the Medical College of Wisconsin">Misconsin</a> to apply for an ARHQ award. Their winning proposal will test two implementation strategies aimed at helping primary care clinics incorporate screening and treatment of urinary incontinence.

**WISCONSIN** 

The primary aim of this interdisciplinary proposal is to compare streamlined practice facilitation with and without partnership building that involves engaging community







resources, building coalitions, providing consultation, and creating an online learning community. The group plans to enroll 50 primary care practices to test their hypothesis.

- **Dr. Brown** is a urogynecologist and Assistant Professor in the Division of Female Pelvic Medicine and Reconstructive Surgery in the Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology at the University of Wisconsin School of Medicine & Public Health.
- Dr. Flynn is a Professor of Hematology and Oncology in the Department of Medicine at the Medical College of Wisconsin. She is also the Scientific Director for Patient-Reported Outcomes in the Center for International Blood and Marrow Transplant Research.
- **Dr. Neuner** is the Georgia Carroll Professor of Women's Health in the Department of Medicine at the Medical College of Wisconsin. She is a physician specializing in internal medicine with a practice at Froedtert Hospital in Milwaukee, WI.
